Our STORY



Mortar Board is a national honor society recognizing college seniors for their exemplary scholarship, leadership, and service.

In 1915, a wearer of a gold pin in the shape of a mortarboard met another wearer of a pin - not like her own, but also in the shape of a mortarboard. Each one represented a group of senior college women striving to render service to their alma mater. The two talked together. If such an ideal existed on two American campuses, it probably existed on many other campuses across the country. Working to generate interest from similar societies elsewhere. on February 15, 1918, delegates from five universities met and together founded Mortar Board.

In 1975, a historic event occurred when membership in our formerly all women's organization was extended to include men as a result of Title IX, which prohibited sex discrimination by organizations on campuses that are recipients of federal funds. The purpose of the Society was strengthened to include emphasis upon the advancement of the status of women. One year later in 1976, we added to the purpose "... to promote equal opportunities among all peoples." And thus formalized Mortar Board's commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion.

The society has grown steadily since our founding over 105 years ago. Now there are 235 chartered collegiate chapters across the United State. Our last two chapters were installed in 2023 at Life University and the College of Charleston.

Since 1918, more than 300,000 members have been initiated into Mortar Board, and we are thrilled that our new members continue to celebrate our history and create new traditions that will keep our society great in the future.

Our purpose is to promote equal opportunities among all peoples; emphasize the advancement of the status of women; support the ideals of the college or university; advance a spirit of scholarship; recognize and encourage leadership; provide service; contribute to the self-awareness of its members; and establish the opportunity for a meaningful exchange of ideas as individuals and as a group.
