

# Governance 101

#### Mortar Board Governance Basics

- Student-governed society your vote matters!
- One vote per chapter
  - Highest-ranking student officer is official voting delegate (usually president)
- We use simplified Robert's Rules of Order
- The Chair runs the meeting and recognizes speakers

#### **Tools You Can Use:**

- "Point of Order" if rules are broken
- "Point of Information" to request clarification
- "Call the Question" to end debate and vote
- "I move that.." to make a motion



#### Discussion Procedures

- Only one person speaks at a time
- Wait to be acknowledged by the Chair and then state your name and chapter
- Only speak to motion on the floor
- Allowed to speak two times per motion
- Chair will call for delegates to speak for or against a motion in alternating order
- Raise hand for either a Point of Order or a Point of Information and wait for Chair to acknowledge
- Discussion will continue until there is no further discussion or someone calls the question

#### Voting Rights at Conference

#### **ARTICLE V**

#### **Section 1 - Conferences**

**Section 1.2** - The only voting members of any conference, in conference committees or in business sessions, shall be the delegates from the collegiate chapters. They shall be considered the supreme governing body of the Society.

**Section 1.4** - Each collegiate chapter shall be represented at conferences by one delegate who shall be the president of the chapter or the designated alternate. The name of the delegate shall be sent by the chapter president to the National Office. Pending verification of voting credentials, the delegate shall have one vote on all questions, whether or not instructed by the chapter.

**Section 1.7** - In the interim between conferences, the government of the Society shall be vested in the National Council.



#### Resolutions & Recommendations Committee Charter

#### Article V, Section 1.6.

Resolutions are the Society's **formal statement of philosophy** or its **deliberate choice of action** and are effective for the **next two years**. Resolutions are looked to by the Society for organizational direction and by chapters for programming direction.

# Proposed *Bylaws*Amendments

#### Amendment 1

Article III Membership
Section 1 - Collegiate Membership Membership
Qualifications
Section 1.5, A & B

Section 1.5 - The scholarship requirements for collegiate membership shall be the minimum of:

**A)** the grade point average representing the upper 35% of the corresponding class-year or;

**B)** a straight B average, whichever is higher, on any given campus.

#### **Action Proposed:**

To delete point B, "a straight B average, whichever is higher, on any given campus."

#### Rationale:

This change would maintain our class rank to stay consistent with the upper 35% of the corresponding class-year. The Association of College Honor Societies (ACHS), established a minimum grade point average of a 3.3 GPA to be used when class rank is not available. As a result, if we were to list a grade point average in our bylaws, we would need to raise our stated minimum from a 3.0 (straight B) to a 3.3 GPA. Our class rank is still in compliance with the ACHS standards, and the use of GPA becomes operational.

Instead of stating our GPA in our bylaws, it will be listed in our operational handbook as noted in the Bylaws, Article III, Section 1.1: Members are selected by the collegiate chapters annually according to the criteria stated in these Bylaws and Mortar Board chapter operational guides.



## Amendment 1 - Proposed Language

\*New language in **bold**, language to strike in purple.

#### **ARTICLE III**

MEMBERSHIP
Section 1 – Collegiate Membership
Membership Qualifications

Section 1.5 – Members are selected by the collegiate chapters annually according to the criteria stated in these Bylaws and Mortar Board chapter operational guides.

Section 1.5 - The scholarship requirements for collegiate membership shall be: the minimum of:

- A) a minimum the grade point average representing the upper 35% of the corresponding class-year-or;
- B) a straight B average, whichever is higher, on any given campus.
- **G)** B) Students are eligible to apply any term after they have completed at least 50% of credits needed for graduation by the end of the term in which they are selected. (Inclusive of 3+2, 5-year, transfer from community colleges, etc.)
- D) If a student is not selected the first time they apply and/or are nominated, they are eligible to reapply in subsequent selection seasons if they have not yet graduated.
- E) D) Students can be selected for membership in their final term prior to graduation as long as the total percentage of students in their final term does not exceed 25% of the total selected students.
