Mortar Board was founded in 1918 as an interdisciplinary honor society for college senior women. Under Title IX, the Society began accepting all genders in 1975, adding to its purpose "to emphasize the advancement of the status of women" and "to promote equal opportunities among all peoples."

Mortar Board has chartered **235** chapters nationwide, with over 100 active today and welcoming 3,000 new members annually. With an alumni network of over 300,000, Mortar Board's people are its greatest asset.

Why Mortar Board?

Most honoraries focus on just your grades. Mortar Board's focus on scholarship, leadership, and service empowers top scholars to continue their leadership development and service to the campus and community.

Is Mortar Board legit?

Yes! We were founded in 1918 and have a selective process with a national reputation of recognizing high achieving students. Mortar Board is also a certified member of the **Association of College Honor Societies**, which helps ensure the credibility of honor societies.

How do I join?

Academically eligible rising junior and senior students are **invited to apply**. Eligible students submit an application detailing academic, leadership, and service accomplishments to their campus-based chapter or the National Chapter if your campus does not currently have a chapter. Applications are reviewed and **new** members are selected by current members. If selected, students are "tapped," which is a long-standing Mortar Board tradition. All new members attend an initiation ceremony to officially become a member!

How much does it cost?

Mortar Board's lifetime membership is a one-time payment of \$100. The lifetime membership continues to provide resources and connections after you graduate, including a vast alumni network - no additional fees are charged. Chapters may add local dues for programming. Mortar Board is committed to ensuring finances are never a barrier to membership through payment plans and gift memberships.

Mortar Board's first National Conference took place in 1918! Over 100 years later, the annual National Leadership Conference is still Mortar Board's signature event.
